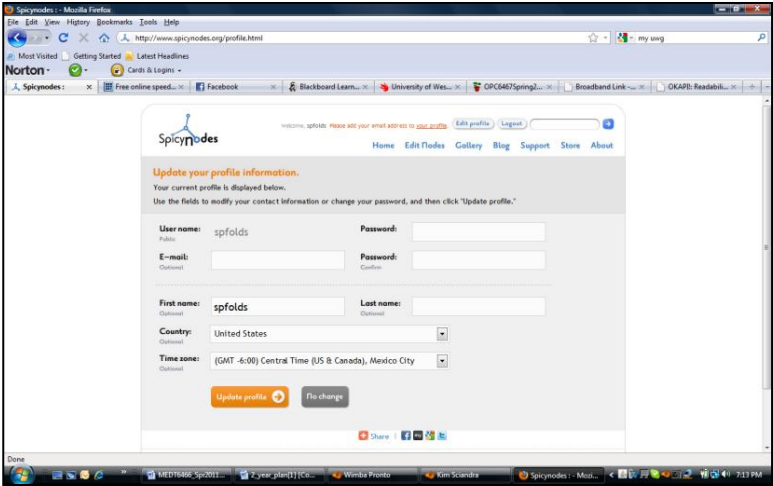

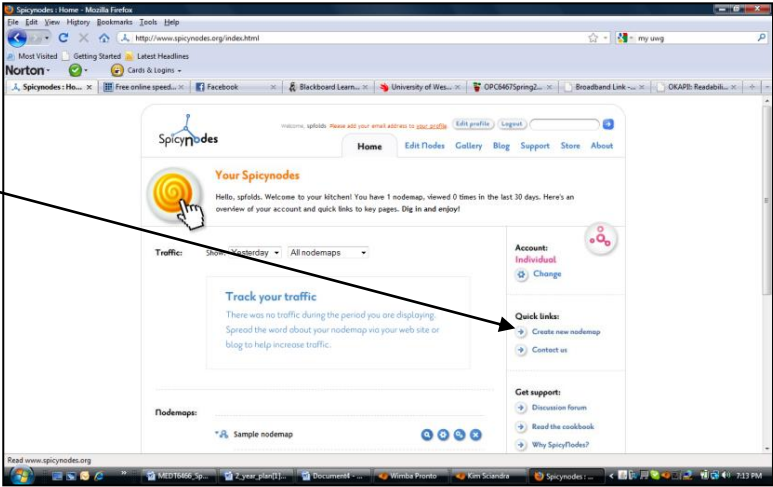
For the purpose of this Tech Tip, I have developed a SpicyNode to help students preview new books.

Go to:

Setup an account.
(Individual accounts are free.)



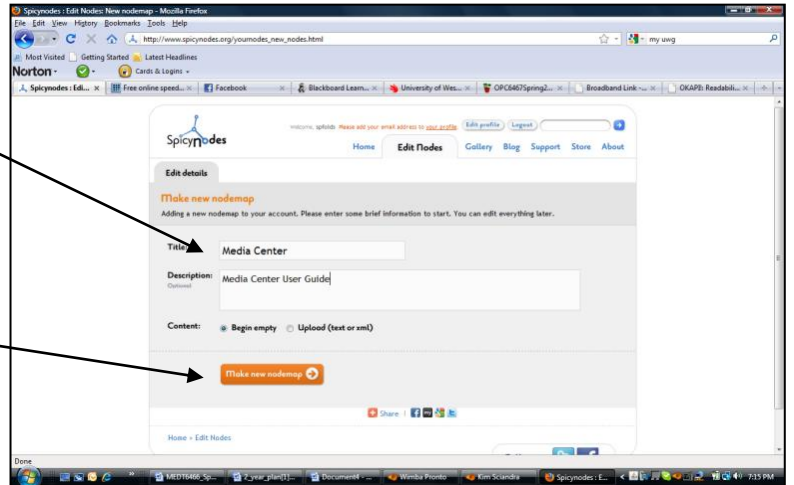
Select "Create new nodemap"



Assign a title for the new nodemap.

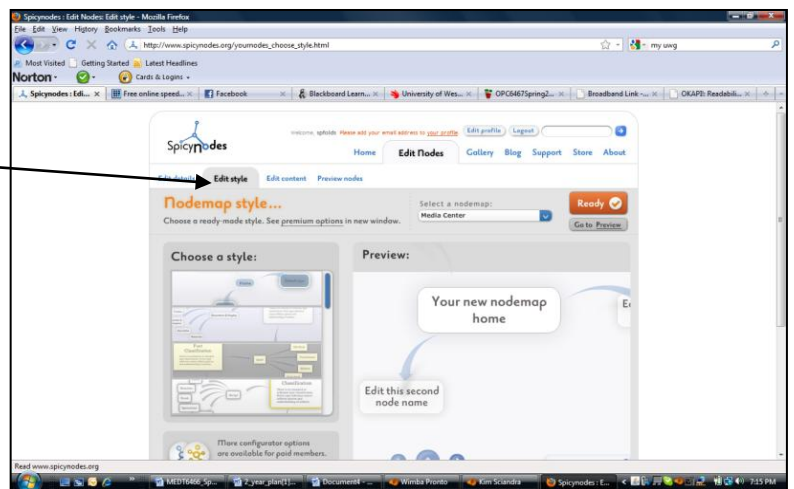
Select "Make a New Nodemap"

Select "Continue"



Select "Edit Style"

Select the style that you prefer.



Select "Edit Content"

To expand/collapse layers, select the blue arrows.

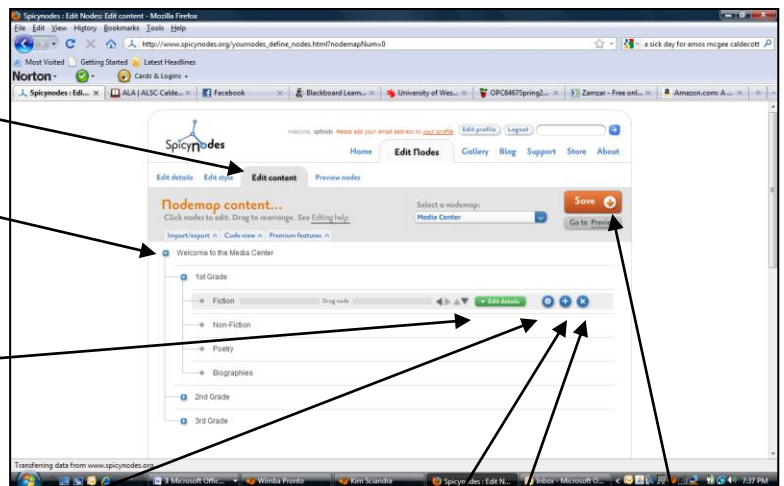
To edit the details, select the green "Edit" button

To cut, copy, or merge, select the blue gear.

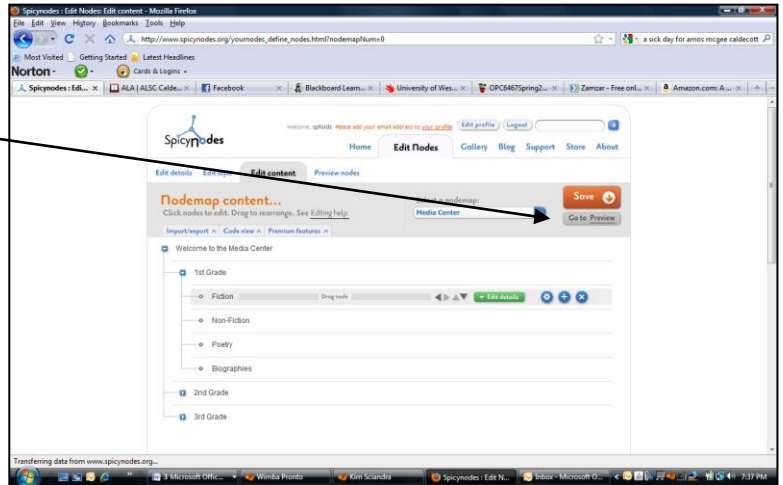
To add layers, select the "+"

To delete layers, select the "--"

"Save" changes

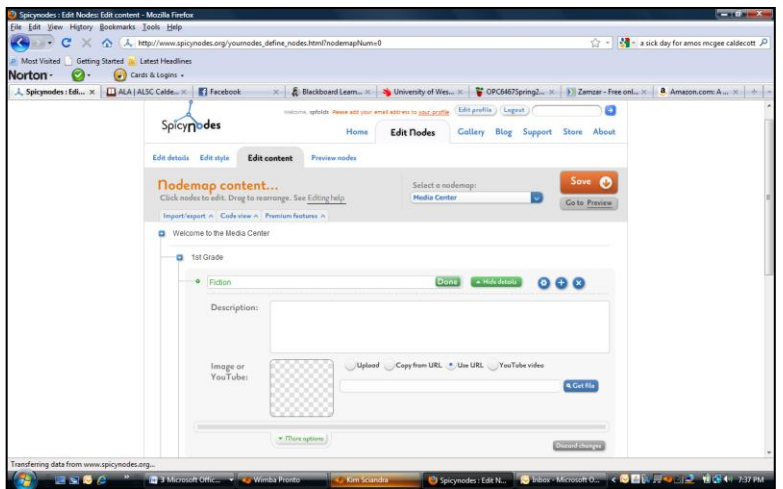


Select "Go to preview" at anytime to Preview SpicyNode.

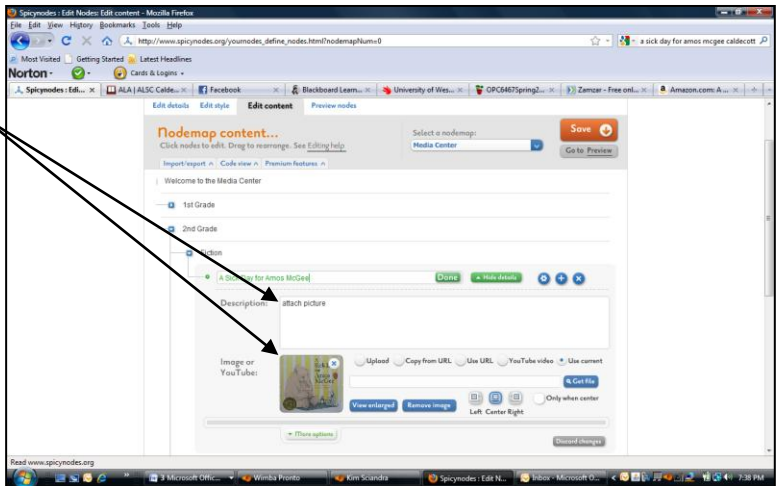


EDIT Options

- Create Links

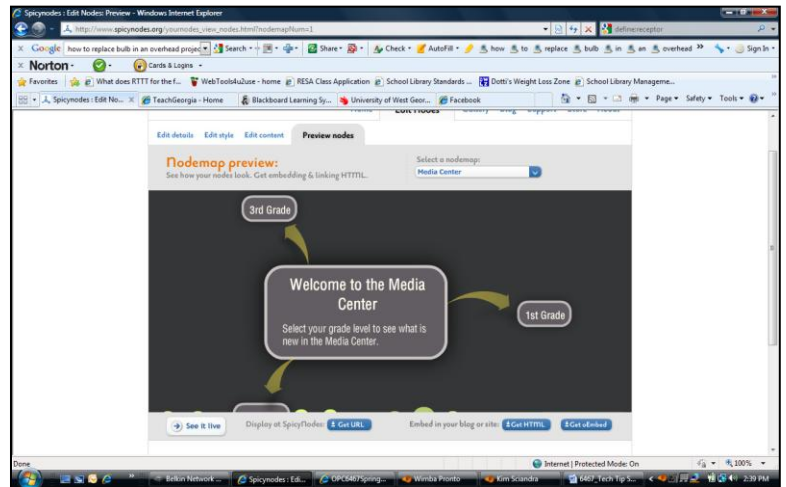


For the purpose I previously mentioned, I added an image of a book and included a brief description.

- Get oEmbed URL



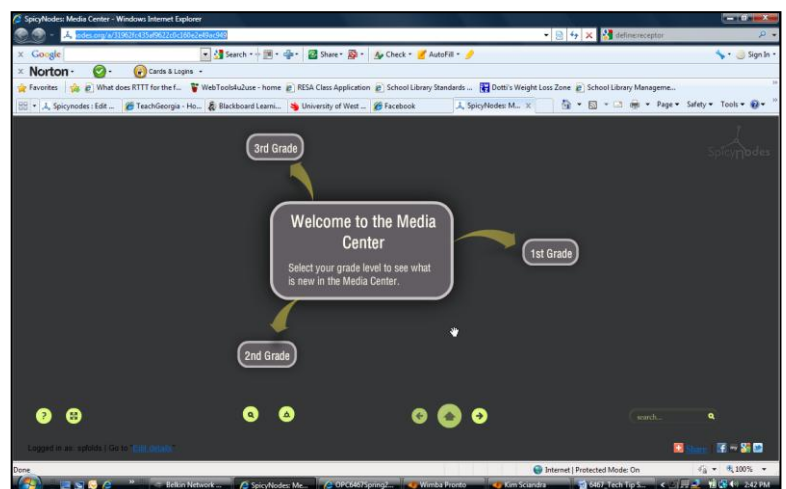
Example

I have created a brief example to demonstrate some of the options available with SpicyNodes.

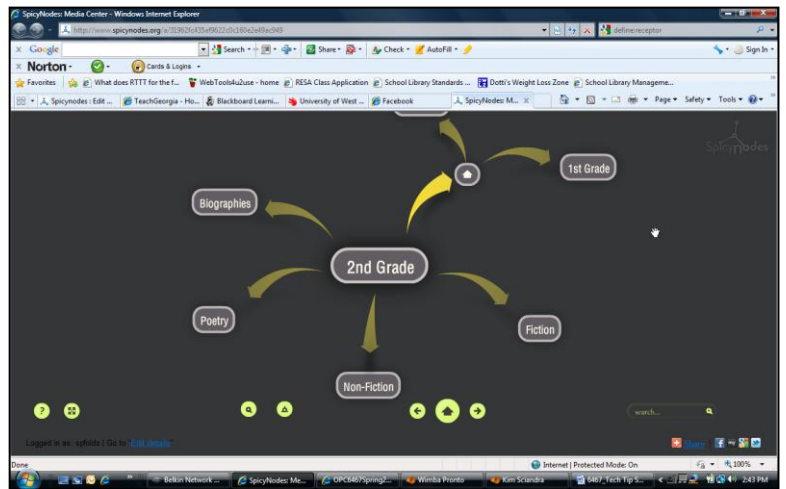

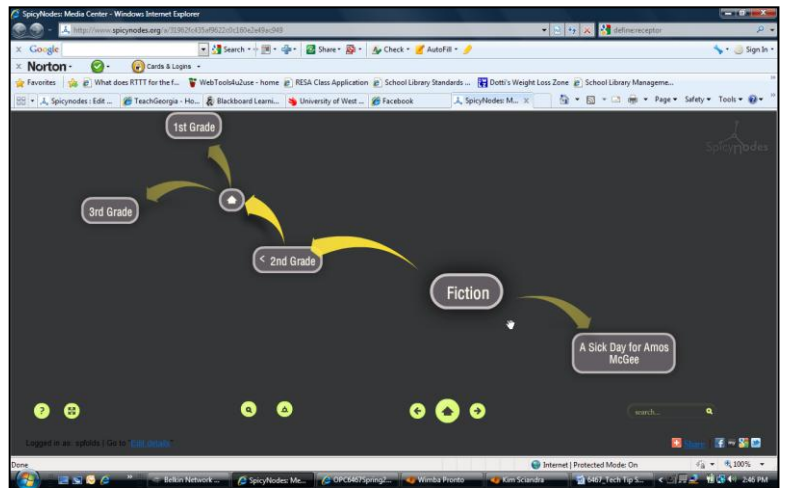
Select “2nd grade”
